A syndicate of 19 from a local sequence dance group is celebrating after waltzing off with a fantastic £200,307 by matching five numbers plus the bonus ball in the main Lotto draw held on 21 June 2006.

The syndicate members, who are all part of the Wednesday Dance Group in Scathoe, are the latest winners from Lotto Lucky Lincolnshire. Now the syndicate winners are putting their best foot forward and having a ball deciding what to do with their win.

Syndicate leader Robert Lake (70), was not surprised with their Lotto luck. He said: "I've just had the feeling our numbers would come up sooner or later. We have been close before but never had a win like this. We are all so happy we really could dance the night away."

Robert was at home with his wife and fellow syndicate member Marjorie (64), when he discovered their win. Robert commented: "When I first saw the results on Teletext I knew we'd won but it is only now it is really starting to sink in. I feel on cloud nine, it's such a fantastic feeling."

Now the members of the syndicate are busy deciding what to do with their winnings. Whilst no one has quick-stepped to the nearest car showroom yet, plans include a trip to Australia for the Ashes series this winter and home improvements.

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The winning ticket, which was a mix of regular numbers, was bought from Martins Newsagents on St. Peters Avenue in Cleethorpes. This is the first time the syndicate had bought their tickets there. The winning Lotto numbers on 21 June were: 8, 16, 27, 38, 44 and the bonus ball 31.

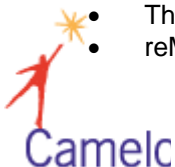
