EuroMillions £88 Million: Facts and Figures

Fun Facts and Stats:

- According to Coutts & Co, HRH The Queen's bankers, if you won this Friday's estimated EuroMillions £88 million jackpot, you would earn approximately £10,879 per day in interest alone – that's £76,000 per week, £330,000 a month and a colossal £3.96 million per year
- If you stacked up £88 million in £50 notes, it would reach 208 metres high – just over four times the size of Nelson's Column
- It would take a Coutts cashier 120 hours to count £88 million in £50 notes – that's exactly five days of solid, continuous counting!

EuroMillions trivia:

- The most frequently drawn EuroMillions ball is 50, having been drawn 13 times this year, most recently on 27 October 2006
- The least frequently drawn EuroMillions ball is 13, which has been drawn only once this year, on 7 April 2006
- The biggest EuroMillions publicity winner to date is Marion Richardson from Gateshead who won a £16.7 million jackpot in April 2004

What could I buy with £88 million..?

- The most expensive car in the world – the Bugatti Veyron – was on sale earlier this week at the Moscow Millionaire Fair for \$1,400,000 (£736,248)
- Goldvish's diamond-encrusted mobile phone, priced at \$1m (£520,000) – the most expensive mobile phone in the world according to the Guinness Book of World Records – is made of 18 carat white gold and decorated with 120 carats of grade one diamonds.
- Buy your own private island – the most expensive island in the world is Fiji's Vatu Vara island which is two miles wide and will set you back \$75 million (£39.4 million).
- The most expensive house in the world – Uptown Court, Surrey – set in 58 acres, boasting 103 rooms and five pools, is a snip at £74 million!
