## **Charlotte Church Celebrates Lotto Triple 'Rock and Rollover'**

Welsh 'Crazy Chick' and TV star, Charlotte Church, is hoping that a lucky National Lottery player will be living the rock and roll lifestyle if they win tomorrow night's Lotto Triple Rollover jackpot (14 October) – with a staggering estimated jackpot of £20 million.

This weekend promises three times the excitement, as this is only the second time since The National Lottery® began nearly 12 years ago that there has been a Lotto Triple Rollover. Wales has already has a 'Lotto' to celebrate this year, with five big jackpot winners created since March on Lotto alone. Now, with lottery fever set to hit the UK, pop diva Charlotte – who rose to fame as a classical vocalist – is keen to make sure that players do not miss out on the chance to win to bag the triple.

Charlotte Church said: "Wales seems to have been a lucky hotspot for jackpot winners over the last year. I've hit a few treble notes myself, so now I've got my fingers crossed that another Welsh winner gets the triple this Saturday night. My lucky numbers are 21 because my birthday's on 21 February and 16 just because I like it, so I'd definitely pick those two."

Lottery history had already been made this week, as Wednesday's (11 October) Double Rollover was actually the landmark 200<sup>th</sup> Lotto Rollover. The only Lotto Triple Rollover to date happened two years ago, when six winning ticket-holders each picked up a massive £3,693,086 share of the jackpot on Saturday 29 May 2004.

From launch in November 1994, The National Lottery has now created well over 1,900 millionaires or multi-millionaires. Any new seven-figure single jackpot winners take the total ever closer to the magical 2,000 millionaires figure – which is estimated to be achieved in December of this year.
