Glasgow Winner Could Be Sitting On A Fortune *Unclaimed £150,481 prize up for grabs in the Glasgow Area*

Somewhere in one lucky Glasgow resident's home are the keys to a brand new house or car – and to unlock this untapped wealth and get their hands on the 'Lotto', an elusive pink piece of paper or till receipt could be just the ticket.

That is exactly what could happen for one lucky National Lottery player who bought a Lotto ticket in the Glasgow area, and has yet to claim a £150,481 prize from the draw on Saturday 17 February 2007. Whether it is hidden in the washing pile, in the pocket of their jeans, or down the back of the sofa, someone could literally be sitting on a brand new car or property.

The search is now on to locate the owner of the winning ticket who matched five numbers and the bonus ball in the Lotto draw on Saturday 17 February 2007. The winning Lotto numbers on that date were 6, 18, 40, 43, 47, 49, and the bonus ball was 32. The lucky ticket-holder has until 5.30pm on Thursday 16 August 2007 to come forward and make their claim. If no-one comes forward with the winning ticket before the prize claim deadline, then the prize money, plus all the interest it has generated, will go to the Good Causes – adding to the £19 billion already raised through sales of lottery tickets since The National Lottery® launched in November 1994.

Once the mystery winner's ticket has been verified they could have the money in their bank account within 24 hours – and up to £5,000 transferred immediately, so they can treat friends and family to a little bit of luxury straight away. The win could buy a one-bedroom luxurious flat in the chic Glasgow Harbour development (from £134,000) – just a stone's throw away from the fantastic leisure facilities the complex has to offer, as well as great restaurants. Alternatively, why not splash out on a luxury car and take the Z4 BMW Coupe for a spin at Harry Fairbairn Ltd in Glasgow (from £31,790)?

With all National Lottery draws, players have 180 days from the day of the draw to claim their win if they have the winning ticket. Anyone who believes they have the winning ticket for any of the National Lottery draws within the 180-day deadline should call the **National Lottery Line** on **0845 910 0000**.

Anyone concerned about lost or unchecked tickets may like to consider setting up a National Lottery subscription, playing Lotto Online, via their mobile phone, or using the Sky Active service on digital TV. Numbers can be entered in advance and lucky winners automatically receive a cheque or are notified online if their numbers come up.
