## King's Lynn Syndicate Say "Tar" To £4.2 Million Lotto Jackpot Win!

A syndicate of four men who all work for M&B Servicing, Road Maintenance Company in King's Lynn has paved the way to their future by scooping a fantastic £4,206,341 win on the Lotto draw (Wednesday 14 March 2007), only weeks after finding out they are being made redundant.

Syndicate leader David Brock (46) from King's Lynn said that the syndicate had gone through a roller coaster of emotions over the last few days. "We were obviously very sad about losing our jobs through redundancy, especially as the company is well respected by the guys and we enjoy working together. But suddenly our future has completely changed with the win and we are all on a high."

It was David's colleague Trevor Kimber (47) from King's Lynn who first discovered the win. Trevor explained: "I was reading the Daily Mirror at work and I thought the numbers looked familiar. The truth is, that I've got it wrong many times before so I didn't believe it. I got the ticket out of the van and said to David, 'you'd better check this and get a copy of the winning numbers'.

"David went into the local supermarket and when he came out said, 'well it's right, we've got every one'. It was a fantastic moment and we're very, very happy of course."

The syndicate is already starting to make plans for the future. Trevor wants to buy a new VW car and take it easy until he decides what to do with his winnings.

The ticket, which was a Lucky Dip<sup>®</sup>, was purchased from Martins Newsagents in Downham Market. The winning numbers on 14 March were 6, 21, 24, 38, 39 and 48.

The members of the syndicate are David Brock (King's Lynn), David Edwards (Wisbech), Trevor Kimber (King's Lynn) and Anthony Fitt (King's Lynn).

Today, Wednesday 21 March there is an estimated £2.6 million Lotto jackpot. While this Friday (23 March) the EuroMillions rollover jackpot is an estimated £28 million. Every Lotto play slip now comes with its own Dream Number – it is up to players to mark 'yes' to give their Dream Number its chance of winning up to £500,000, or choose a Lucky Dip<sup>®</sup>.
