

Lotto Prize Remains Unclaimed In Dundee & Surrounding Area

An amazing Lotto prize of **£53,673** has yet to be claimed in the Dundee and surrounding area and National Lottery players are being urged to check and double-check their tickets for the chance to claim this life-enhancing prize.

The search is now on to find the owner of the winning ticket, bought in the Dundee and the surrounding area, who matched five numbers and the bonus ball in the Lotto draw on Saturday 6 October 2007. The winning numbers on that date were 5, 6, 18, 22, 24 and 38. The bonus ball was 10. The lucky ticket-holder has until 5.30pm on Thursday 3 April 2008 to come forward to make their claim.

If no-one comes forward with the winning ticket before the prize claim deadline, then the prize money, plus all the interest it has generated, will go to the Good Causes – adding to the £20 billion already raised through sales of lottery tickets since The National Lottery® launched in November 1994.

This is not the only outstanding prize in the Dundee area. A **£56,501** Lotto prize from the draw on Wednesday 19 September 2007 has still not been claimed. The lucky winner who matched five numbers plus the bonus ball has until Monday 17 March 2008 to come forward. The winning Lotto numbers on 19 September 2007 were 2, 5, 6, 13, 25, 47 and the bonus ball was 45

If either of the winners comes forward they could indulge in the ultimate Dundee shopping spree. A mere £18,580 and a visit to Barnet's Garage could buy the winner a very sporty brand new Mazda MX-5 Roadster Coupe, while treating themselves or a loved one to a stunning eighteen carat white gold necklace from Beaverbrooks Jewellers would cost £3,250. Or what better way to beat the Autumn blues than a 11-day trip to the sun drenched island of Antigua through Barrhead Travel for £2,438.

A National Lottery spokesperson said: “We’re desperate to find these mystery ticket-holders and unite them with their winnings. We’re urging everyone to check their old tickets again or look anywhere a missing Lotto ticket could be hiding. These life-enhancing prizes could really help to make a few dreams become a reality for someone out there.”

To jog Lotto players’ memories, on Saturday 6 October 2007, *The Heartbreak Kid* starring Ben Stiller was showing at cinemas across the country, and the Sugababes topped the singles chart with *About You Now*. Closer to home, Dundee United fans were celebrating their 1-0 home win against Motherwell in the Scottish Premier League. However Dundee FC fans were not so lucky as their team lost 2-0 against Hamilton in the Scottish First Division. Local Beatles fans may have sung the night away with the Cavern Beatles at Whitehall Theatre or those with a classical ear may have joined the musicians of the Scottish Ensemble at Marryat Hall.

With all National Lottery draws, players have 180 days from the day of the draw to claim their prize if they have the winning ticket. Anyone who believes they have the winning ticket for any of the National Lottery draws within the 180-day deadline should call the **National Lottery Line** on **0845 910 0000**.

Anyone concerned about lost or unchecked tickets may like to consider either setting up a National Lottery Subscription, playing online at www.national-lottery.co.uk, on their mobile phone, or by using the Sky Active service on digital TV.
