EuroMillions Prize Unclaimed In Liverpool

An amazing **£64,260** prize has yet to be claimed in the Liverpool area from the EuroMillions draw on 10 August 2007, so National Lottery players are being urged to check and double-check their tickets for the chance to claim this life-enhancing prize.

The search is now on to find the owner of the winning ticket, who matched the five main numbers in the EuroMillions draw on Friday 10 August 2007. The winning EuroMillions numbers on that date were 23, 40, 42, 43 and 49. The lucky ticket-holder has until 5.30pm on Wednesday 6 February 2008 to come forward and make their claim.

If no-one comes forward with the winning ticket before the prize claim deadline, then the prize money, plus all the interest it has generated, will go to the Good Causes – adding to the £20 billion already raised through sales of lottery tickets since The National Lottery launched in November 1994.

A National Lottery spokesperson said: “We’re desperate to find this mystery ticket-holder and unite them with their winnings – this amazing prize could really make a difference to somebody’s life. We’re urging everyone to check their old tickets again or look anywhere a missing ticket could be hiding.

“Try checking in the pockets of clothing, in wallets, bags and down the back of the sofa – someone out there could literally be sitting on a fortune! We have the champagne on ice and our fingers crossed that the lucky winner comes forward to claim their win.”

This EuroMillions draw on Friday 10 August in Scottish postal worker, Angela Kelly, from East Kilbride, making National Lottery history by becoming the biggest ever UK winner, scooping an amazing £35.4 million jackpot.

To jog players' memories, 10 August 2007 was also the eve of the new Premiership football season and fans across Liverpool would have been getting their shirts and scarves ready for the matches. With all National Lottery draws, players have 180 days from the day of the draw to claim their prize if they have the winning ticket. Anyone who believes they have the winning ticket for any of the National Lottery draws within the 180-day deadline should call the **National Lottery Line** on **0845 910 0000**.

Anyone concerned about lost or unchecked tickets may like to consider either setting up a National Lottery Subscription, playing online at www.national-lottery.co.uk, on their mobile phone, or by using the Sky Active service on digital TV.
