

## **Lotto Prize Remains Unclaimed In Cheltenham & Evesham**

An amazing Lotto prize worth **£72,840** has yet to be claimed in the Cheltenham and Evesham area, and National Lottery players are being urged to check and double-check their tickets for the chance to claim this life-enhancing prize.

The search is now on to find the owner of the winning ticket, bought in the Cheltenham and Evesham area, who matched five numbers plus the bonus ball in the Lotto draw on Saturday 29 March 2008. The winning Lotto numbers on that date were 11, 17, 28, 31, 40, 43 and the bonus ball was 39. The lucky ticket-holder has until 5.30pm on Thursday 25 September 2008 to come forward to make their claim.

If no-one comes forward with the winning ticket before the prize claim deadline, then the prize money, plus all the interest it has generated, will go to the Good Causes – adding to the £20 billion already raised through sales of lottery tickets since The National Lottery launched in November 1994.

A National Lottery spokesperson said: “We’re desperate to find this mystery ticket-holder and unite them with their winnings – this amazing prize could really make a difference to somebody’s life. We’re urging everyone to check their old tickets again or look anywhere a missing ticket could be hiding.

“Try checking in the pockets of clothing, in wallets, bags and down the back of the sofa – someone out there could literally be sitting on a fortune! We have the champagne on ice and our fingers crossed that the lucky winner comes forward to claim their win.”

To jog Lotto players’ memories, on Saturday 29 March 2008, *27 Dresses* was showing at cinemas across the country – while Duffy topped the album chart with *Rockferry* and Estelle featuring Kayne West topped the singles chart with *American Bay*.

Numbers can be entered in advance and lucky winners are notified online if their numbers come up.
