Another Mystery Jackpot Prize Remains Unclaimed In Devon

Now the search is on for a mystery Lotto jackpot winner in Plymouth – after only last week a previously outstanding £6.9 million EuroMillions ticket, purchased in the County of Devon area remained unclaimed.

This time it is a life-changing **£1,413,394** Lotto jackpot which has yet to be claimed and National Lottery players are being urged to check and double-check their tickets for the chance to come forward in time. The owner of the winning ticket, which was bought in the Plymouth area, matched all six numbers in the Lotto draw on Wednesday 5 March 2008. The winning Lotto numbers on that date were 8, 14, 16, 39, 43, 47, and the bonus ball was 38.

The lucky ticket-holder has until 5.30pm on Monday 1 September 2008 to come forward to make their claim. If no-one comes forward with the winning ticket before the prize claim deadline, then the prize money, plus all the interest it has generated, will go to the Good Causes – adding to the £20 billion already raised through sales of lottery tickets since The National Lottery launched in November 1994.

A National Lottery spokesperson said: “We’re desperate to find this mystery ticket-holder and unite them with their winnings – this amazing prize could really make a difference to somebody’s life.

“We tried very hard to find the £6.9 million EuroMillions ticket-holder and it’s a real shame that they have missed out on such a large fortune. To avoid this happening to the lucky ticket-holder in Plymouth, we are urging everyone to check their old tickets again or look anywhere a missing ticket could be hiding.

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“Try checking in the pockets of clothing, in wallets, bags and down the back of the sofa – someone out there could literally be sitting on a fortune! We have the champagne on ice and our fingers crossed that the lucky winner comes forward to claim their win.”

To jog Lotto players' memories, on Wednesday 5 March 2008, *The Bank Job* starring Jason Statham, was showing at cinemas across the country, Duffy topped the singles chart with *Mercy*, while Amy Winehouse was at the top of the album chart with *Back to Black – The Deluxe Edition*.

Closer to home, Plymouth Argyle FC fans were celebrating their 4-1 home win against Colchester United in the Coca-Cola Football League Championship – while locals sat back and enjoyed the romantic comedy adaption of the hit movie *The Wedding Singer* live on stage at the Theatre Royal in Plymouth.

With all National Lottery draws, players have 180 days from the day of the draw to claim their prize if they have the winning ticket. Anyone who believes they have the winning ticket for any of the National Lottery draws within the 180-day deadline should call the **National Lottery Line** on **0845 910 0000**.

Anyone concerned about lost or unchecked tickets may like to consider either setting up a National Lottery Subscription, playing online at www.national-lottery.co.uk, on their mobile phone, or by using the Sky Active service on digital TV.
